Leyburn, second fri. in February for cattle; May, pleasure & cattle; October, fri. sheep, & sat. cattle & December for cattle; market day, fri. & a market for cattle every other fri

Loftus, June for wool; market day, sat

Malton, for the week before Palm Sunday, sat. before Whitsuntide, October 11 & 12 & sat. before November 23; market day, sat. & a market for cattle every tues

Masham, September 17 & 18 for sheep, horned cattle & pedlars' ware; market day, wed

Middleham, March 30, November 5, 6 & 7, the last named one of the greatest fairs in the North of England for horses, cattle & sheep

Middlesbrough, Market day, sat. & a weekly coal & iron market on tues

Muker, a small market is held on wed. but is almost obsolete. The feast is held on the wed. before Old Christmas Day

Northallerton, February 7 for horses; February 14 for horses & horned cattle; May 5 & 6 for horses, cattle, sheep & leather; September 5 & 6 for horned cattle & sheep; October 3 & 4 for horned cattle & sheep; & second wed. in October for cheese; market day, wed
